The position is for an initial period of three years commencing on 1st January 2022 (although the handover from the current Editor-in-Chief will begin in October 2021). The initial term may be extended by mutual agreement. The Editor-in-Chief will be appointed by and report to representatives from ASPB, SEB and Wiley, and the role carries an annual honorarium.

Publish your Registered Report in *Plant Direct*

Plant Direct now offers Registered Reports.

Registered Reports are a type of article where a study proposal is peer-reviewed before the research is undertaken. Registered Reports bring many positive outcomes. By providing external validation of the study methods, they ensure that the research plans are appropriate, helping to avoid inconclusive studies. Further, they avoid the common bias in publishing to publish only “positive” results—the findings of the research proposed in a Registered Report will normally be published even when they don’t support the author’s model or hypothesis.

Registered Reports enable you to increase the transparency of your published research by pre-registering your work and have your proposed methods and analyses reviewed, prior to conducting the actual research. This means that a significant part of your manuscript will be peer-reviewed before the data collection is complete – with submissions accepted in advance.

***Plant Direct* offers preprint and supporting society discounts on author fees**

Plant Direct's publication charge for authors submitting directly to the journal is \$2,200. The following discounts are available on publication fees; the single highest discount applies.
